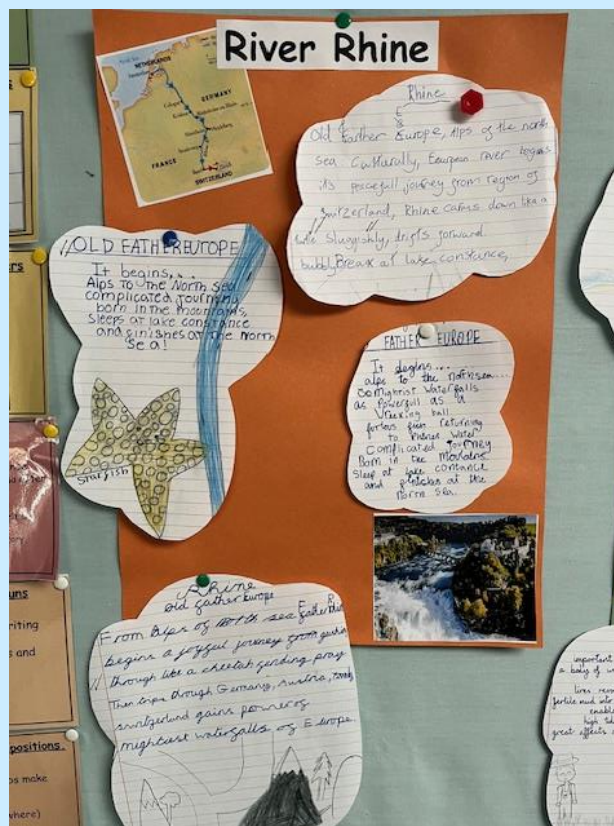

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School Orchard Plans

Last week we welcomed Dan from **BrightMinded** (an ex Brunswick parent) and Stephan from **Brighton Permaculture Trust** who came to talk to some of our Y6 children about planting a school orchard. The Eco team and Gardening gang helped measure out the space and dig down to investigate the soil. They worked out we could fit 7 fruit trees (and choose a combination of apple, pear and plum) and found the soil was loamy which is good for planting. We hope the trees will be planted this winter; and will be involving some more of the children with the next stage.

A special thanks to Dan and **BrightMinded** for suggesting and sponsoring the orchard and to Stephan for guiding us through the planning stage in such an engaging way!
